My target market consisted of men and women between the ages of 20-30 who were active in using online dating apps. My goal for my target market, was to understand how they used online dating apps, and how often they used them, along with their likes and dislikes of the apps. With this, I wanted to get inside the head of the app users and figure out the journey they take when using a dating app.

Key Findings

Between the five interviewees, the majority of them only used one to two different online dating apps. It was almost split in half in terms of how many hours they spend on dating apps,

with two interviewees spending 3-5 hours a week on dating apps, and three interviewees spending 0-2 hours a week on dating apps. All but one of the interviewees stated that they would prefer preset questions rather than an open profile. All interviewees talked about struggling to present themselves in a good and accurate light to those reading their profile. Two interviewees said that they would spend money on a dating app, while three said they would not. It was interesting to see that the same four dating apps were used between all five users. This tells me that these apps have features that a lot of users really value.

Takeaway

What I have gathered from these responses, is that my target market wants an online dating experience that is simple and effortless. They do not want to have to put a lot of thought into their personal bios, but rather fill out preset questions that will enable them to project their likes, dislike, and passions to those reading their profile. Many of the interviewees mentioned liking features that were not necessarily the main point of the app. For example, the interviewees liked apps where they could see social media, their matches height, scroll rather than tap, and see how many individuals liked their profile. These little features enable users to make a more informed decision about individuals before getting too deep into a profile or conversation.
